1. Read the given passage carefully and then answer the questions based on it:

- 1. Appreciation is not just an ornamental word to be used skilfully in articulate situations. It's a genuine expression of heartfelt acceptance of someone's act worthy to be praised.
- 2. Appreciating somebody means that we acknowledge his worthy act. It's a spontaneous opinion to applaud any task which is beyond the routine course of life. It holds its relevance, to express reference, for everyone, be they young or old. It brings pleasantness in the atmosphere and showers drops of joy on the person praised.
- 3. Appreciation is displayed through a huge round of applause or a kind gesture of bestowing a gift or uttering praiseworthy words or perhaps all of them together. The intensity or quantity doesn't demean the value of appreciation. Applause may be brief, the gift might be trivial and words might be less, appreciation works wonders brightening the spirits.
- 4. Always be true to your words. When you consider an act as commendable, do praise and do mean it as well. Appreciation doesn't rob one of any treasure nor does it crown the person admired. So be generous in admiration. It's the wonderful charity which can benefit both the giver and the taker. It is

an investment which swells into smiles when spent earnestly. Never lose a single chance to appreciate somebody. Make it a point to praise at least one person in a day and you will find yourself more cheerful, contented and amazed at the effect of a gesture, which seems so trivial.

- 5. We gain and lose nothing while praising. Although peace of mind comes when we have an atmosphere of harmony around us. Unnecessary criticism and indulging in a war of words gives us no happiness. It is easier to be sarcastic than appreciative. So why not try something tough! The consequences would be, beyond any doubt, fruitful and satisfying.
- 6. Suppose you begin a day with a smile and a simple 'Thank You' for anything good done to you. It would certainly make your morning worthwhile. The smile which you initiate spreads like sunshine. The stress and anxiety which grips a sullen heart disappear all of a sudden. Such is the power of a smile!
- 7. Never undermine the importance of praise. Consider it as the bounty which would flourish with frequent expenditure. You never know what magic your kind gesture might perform. Perhaps a disheartened heart might rejuvenate. Perhaps a dejected soul might blossom. Won't it be a satisfying act? We are simple humans and these simple gestures keep us human. Thrill yourself and the rest of the community too.
- 8. So, from now on let everyday be glorified with an act of praise. Let appreciation be a habit, not compulsion. Make it a part of your life and enjoy the boon of being appreciated for appreciation!!

2. Read the given passage carefully:

- 1. The defence mechanism of human body is a gift of nature provided to human beings. The power of our body to fight against various disease-producing agents is known as defensive mechanism. This defence mechanism depends upon various factors which can be categorised mainly into two types—common factors and special factors.
- 2. Amongst the common factors, the most important is the health of human beings. We all know if we have a good health, our body automatically remains protected against the diseases. For keeping good health, one should have nutritious balanced diet. A balanced diet is that which contains carbohydrates, fat, proteins, vitamins in proportionate amount.
- 3. The skin of our body saves us against many microorganisms producing diseases, provided that it is intact. In case there are cuts or abrasions on it, the microorganisms penetrate the body through those cuts and abrasions and can cause diseases. Therefore, a cut or an abrasion should never be left open. In case there is no bandage, etc. available, it may be covered by a clean cloth.
- 4. Some bacteria are residing on and inside the human body. They are our friends and are useful for us. They do not cause any disease and by their presence they do not allow disease-causing organisms to settle on those places. For example, the microorganisms, present in human saliva secrete a chemical which does not allow diphtheria causing bacteria to grow inside the oral cavity.
- 5. The human body secretes a variety of fluids, which are killers for disease causing microorganisms. For example, gastric juice (acidic in nature) secreted by our intestinal tract kills all organisms which enter our body through food.
- 6. There are a few automatic activities of our body known as 'reflex phenomenon' which protect the body against many infections. This reflex phenomenon includes sneezing, coughing and vomiting.
- 7. Fever is one of the most important constituents of the defensive mechanism of our body. The organ which regulates the temperature of our body is known as hypothalamus and it is situated in the brain.

When microorganisms after entering the body release toxic products and these reach the brain through blood, the hypothalamus starts increasing the temperature of the body and the person gets fever. This fever is very useful for the human body because by the increase of temperature the microorganisms which are the root cause of the problem get killed.
